

The new season got with a bang. Lots of fish across all the KLAA Waters.

Helped by the cooler weather rather than the baking sun that usually greets anglers on June 16.

Anglers on the Middle Level reporting having more fish than ever before in the early weeks, with several catches around the 100lb mark.

Alex Bates from Tackle & Bates topping the charts on opening night with 39 bream and tench, helped by prebaiting sessions. A brilliant start as he only fished for 5 hours.

But there are quality fish to be caught.
Anglers are finding more success there than in recent previous years.

Sizeable bream seem to have disappeared on the Ouse but good nets over 20lb. Of roach, Rudd and skimmers on any method, with a few tench to liven things up.

The Relief Channel where some big nets of Bream and Tench particularly to those night fishing and feeding heavily have featured. 18 big bream to an angler who spent a Saturday night on the bank a good reward. Whilst day time catches have not been huge there has been some good catches in several sections. With bream approaching 10lb and big tench likely to pop up at anytime the venue has to be worth a go. Plenty of big perch on worm to.
