Few anglers on the bank, so very difficult to come up with too much exciting news.

Modney Bridge seems to be one of the few places where anglers are having success on Ten Mile Bank. All be mostly small fish but guess that's better than no activity at all.

Anglers trying other sections where they had been having success blanking and biteless last week.

Chill nights curtailing the action. Then some sunny days making sitting on the bank fishing an attractive proposition. Then back comes the rain as more water pours down our rivers.

Still fish to be had with bream and perch on the feeder in some sections of the Relief Channel but you need to search for them and be in the right place at the right time to benefit. Anglers have been turning to waggler catching good roach and rudd with sweetcorn being the top bait

I often refer to times past. I can remember before pole fishing was everyone's choice, waggler fishing was the way to go on the Channel. Searching for the fish as the water flowed one way then the other, catching some good roach. More recently it's been bream or bust.

Good roach fishing would make the venue more attractive, but the fish would need to escape the attention of the cormorants. So much rain the last few days the Channel has been unfishable but catch it fining down and it could be a different story.
