

The Wissey Mouth a historical bream and carp hot spot, but where are they now?



Anglers were hoping a mild spell and not too much rain enabling them to see some in action over the holiday period. Some better bream and roach were caught not far from the afore mentioned Wissey Mouth. Whilst plenty of roach were showing around Modney Bridge.

Unfortunately the fish were mostly small but then again having bites all day and catching fish even if not specimens has got to be better than blanking or not fishing. Pole, whip and feeder methods all catching their fair share of fish.

There appeared to be more predator anglers on the banks achieving a degree of success as this 18lb 8oz pike below indicates. A great fish to finish the year with.



This time of year bream can usually be found feeding on the Relief Channel where a few bites and a few quality fish feeding is well worth the effort. Plenty of perch about to but not heard of any tench recently.

Shepherds Port not very busy but a few anglers on the banks most days. Kings Lake Skimmers and roach with a few carp. Waggler a successful method for the skimmers and roach as they are often found feeding mid water.

Chub and bream featuring on Shepherds Lake caught on the feeder with pellet on the hook, although some go for pink boilies . A favourite on the venue.

Anglers always giving Bear Lake a go at various times during the day tempting out roach and carp on a variety of methods.
