
West Norfolk Sub Aqua Club to the rescue

On the fishing front Shepherds Lake continues to flourish. Bream to lb., Tench at 4lb and a carp weighing in at 16lb just one anglers catch in a session.

Ambrose Draper often seen in action on Facebook has enjoyed some good sport there including 3 carp best, a Personal best tipping the scales at 19lb-7oz meaning there are bigger ones in there for him to up his PB. Plus 5 bream and a chub in his catch. Another session saw him catch 8 bream before he cooked his breakfast (I always bailiff to late)

Bear Lake going well as usual, noticeable that a few anglers like to use a carp wand or short feeder rod which ensures they feed regularly and play the better fish perhaps easier than on pole or waggler. Then again, it's down to the angler on how to tackle this very attractive lake.

Improved catches on Kings though not that many anglers make the walk but Both bream and carp nets reported this week on pellet. Few carp showing on Springside.

Both Bear and Shepherds Lake very busy in the week. Come the recent weekend both anglers and fish were in hibernation, keeping away from the very cold wind, was my guess.

Ashley has been strimming this week giving all the lakes a very good trim and tidy up, they all look good very attractive and very "fishy".
