

A peaceful Great Ouse Full of Fish to



The Ouse still fishing well on all methods. Roach Rudd and skimmers filling nets with a few bonus Tench as an added attraction. Sir Bob Nudd waxing lyrical about the beautiful River Great Ouse above Denver Sluice. Fabulous fishing on a natural venue, solid with fish, it's great fishing, some of his comments whilst taking a guest fishing for the day, who driven from Middlesbrough to learn from the master. It makes you appreciate what we have on our doorstep, sometimes I think Danby Drove is too far to drive.

They started on the feeder catching fish from the off. Then turned to using a 6 meter whip around 8 meters out and 5 meters deep. Ground baiting with balls of ground bait containing chopped worm and caster. Caster or worm on the hook attracting the better fish, nothing huge but by catching consistently a big catch is soon accrued.

Middle Level fishing reasonably although not particularly busy. St Germans for skimmers and bream over ground bait. Conditions have seemed ideal for bream with colour and a good ripple below a cloudy sky but unfortunately the fish have not played ball. Then again, the redesigned riverbed and possible little natural feed until nature redresses the balance, may have an effect. Fish appear to be up in the water as they search for food so pole or waggler could be worth a go. Perhaps prebaiting and/or fishing the same pegs could help to catch more to.

Once again, a few Tench has added to the excitement.
