

Another river season underway. The good news is that whilst there was not big numbers of fish caught in every peg overall results were very good.

The Ouse full of fish from Denver Sluice to Littleport. Modney bridge section surprising some with an odd bream, tench, skimmers roach and rudd. Railway Bridge, Browns Farm 2 other successful sections Bream featured at Littleport where prebaiting and night fishing rewarded anglers for their efforts.

Similarly the same preparation and methods saw close to 100lb catches of bream on the Relief Channel. Unfortunately anglers returning to the same pegs the following night didn't meet with the same success.

Good bream catches on the Lower Middle Level on opening night where particle baits were successful but after having their fill the bream appeared to move away. Overall roach

bream and some hard fighting tench kept anglers happy as the early indications are that the dredging of the drain has not caused any problems. I did see one eel over 3 foot long. (Big eels to from Shepard's Lake to).

Of some concern is that the pathways by the water in some areas are not very wide, if anglers are already in place as more arrive, care must be taken to avoid any tackle in use.

The sun brought out the bream on the Cut Off Chanel but only to bask and not feed, but then again another day who knows. Large shoals around always offers some hope and encouragement.
