Great weights on the Ouse in several sections, with the Wissey Mouth to Railway Bridge and the Modney Bridge area two of the most popular sections, perhaps the introduced feed holding the fish in those areas.

Once again whip fishing over ground bait very successful, with a net of over 50lb reported. Slider fishing worth the effort in the Modney section with nets to 35lb reported. Time when that was often the go to method before poles began to rule.Just slide the knot and fish can be searched for at all depths.

Bream feeding well on the Relief Channel but weed causing some problems.

King of the Fens match on the Middle Level at Peters Drove was won convincingly by Darren Ogden with 18 lb 13oz, 2nd Phil Chesterton 9-61/2, 3rd Sean Stimson 8-15; 4th Bob Bates 8-4.

Darren was feeder fishing using chopped worms in his ground bait with worm variations on the hook, to finish well ahead of the rest.

Pole over ground bait accounting for the other places.

Overall, not a bad match result for the first one there of the season. Matches always create a bit more commotion, disturbing the fish until they get acclimatised. Perhaps the dredging has not caused too many problems, judging by this result but still early days on that front. One problem is that an occasional peg seems to have immovable obstructions on the drain bed, not surprising when you see some of the Debris in the spoil. Peg 4 upstream of Peters one of these.

Fishing has been good around St Germans with bream skimmers, roach and some super Tench showing up on pole and feeder this week.

Shepherds Port still producing. Bear Lake for carp and roach as usual.

Kings Lake going really well for good nets of bream. Proving that not all the bream anglers have departed for the rivers.
