All methods successful, slider still catching well around Modney, plenty of fish on the pole and whip around the Wissey Mouth, although I am told not many net fish. However, catching fish all day and a good weight is the result. Anglers preferring to fish the feeder scoring well too and always in with a chance of a bigger fish.

Middle Level probably the top water with roach and lots of skimmers with an occasional big bream keeping anglers more than happy. All this, despite the high temperatures and lack of water, although that is forecast to change so the water could get a refresh.
