The season continues to flourish with some really good fishing on most waters. The Middle Level constantly exceeding expectations and fishing really well considering it was dredged in the winter, and all anglers were concerned as to its outcome and the possible affect on their sport. Hopefully I will be able to continue with the same narrative all season.

Great catches at St Germans. Whip or pole over groundbait a popular choice for many. Roach, Skimmers and occasional Bream filling nets. Catches from a few pounds to in excess of 30lb a session.

The Ouse attracting visiting anglers practicing for the upcoming Nationals. Fish all along but the most consistent sections being the Wissey Mouth and Modney Bridge areas if only because they are heavily fed and fished more regularly. The piggeries section from years past was always a bream hot spot with a few beginning to show there now.

Small fish mainly roach showing on the Relief Channel during the day but if you want the bream then a night fishing session and plenty of groundbait is required.

Shepherds Lake is the place to be for carp catches. 13-year-old Daniel Coote travelling from Nottingham to stay at a nearby caravan and spend his school holidays, having a fantastic time fishing there. Last weekend, saw him catch 5 carp best at 23lb, consequently he will be rushing back as soon as he can, to try and do even better.
